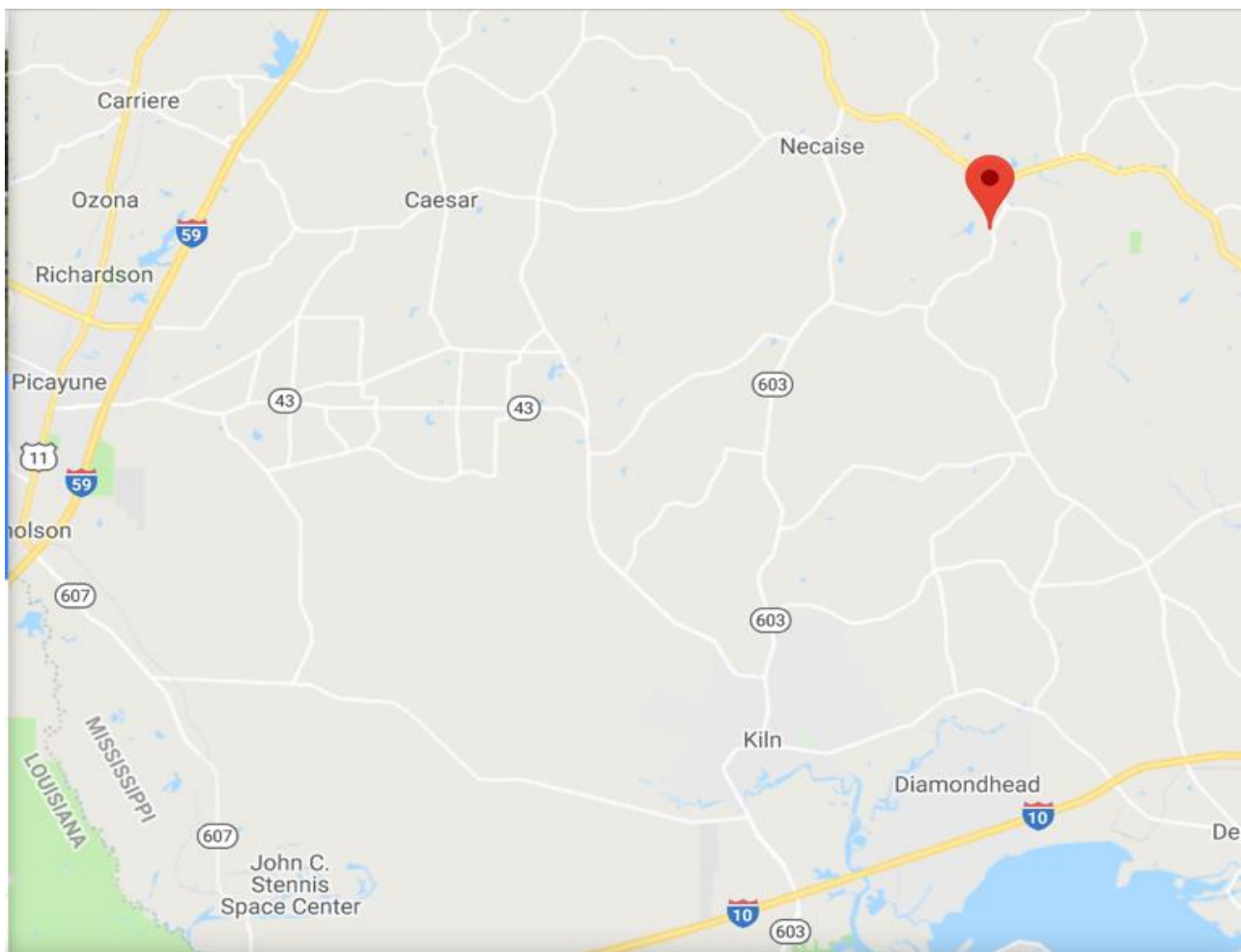

Fellowship Campout Specifics

Fees

\$5 per participant (all scouts and all adults); fee includes an event patch.

- The last day to register for the campout is Wednesday, January 7, 2022.
- No refunds will be available after January 7, 2022.
- There will be no ability to register at camp on the day of the event.
- Fees paid by one scout or adult may be transferred to another scout or adult up to the day of the event.

Payment of Fees:

Meals

Packs and Troops are responsible for all their own meals. There will be no access to the Dining Hall or to the Trading Post.

Program Activities

Troops will be asked to select a scout skill to present to the Webelos and Arrow of Light scouts. The District staff will contact all participating troops to coordinate the scout skills. The shooting sports range will be available.

Troops will each provide at least one skit or song for the campfire. These will be submitted to the District staff prior to the event. Packs are welcome to submit skits and songs if they wish.

Campsites:

We will be using Indian Head and Houma for this campout. Campsite assignments will be made after registration closes. In general, the intent is for Troops to camp at Indian Head and Packs to camp at Houma.

Troops and Packs wishing to attend the Saturday activities, but not camp overnight are welcome to do so. However, all attendees must register through Doubleknot and pay the required fees.

We are not able to support arrival / camping on Friday night. All units are asked to check in at the times listed on page 4 of this Leader Guide.
