ADVANCED ARROW OF LIGHT PROGRAM



The Advanced Arrow of Light Program at the Pathfinder Area will focus on the AOL Required Adventures (Building a Better World, Outdoor Adventurer, and Scouting Adventure) and will also branch into Boy Scout rank requirements up to first class.

*Duty to God in Action is also an AOL Required Adventure but has been omitted from this program because almost all of its requirements are family based. The personal nature of these requirements is not well suited to the group activity program we will be offering at this camp.

ARROW OF LIGHT



Building a Better World Pin



We all want to live in a better World and it all starts with you being a great citizen! In this adventure scouts will learn about laws, the flag, and what we can do to be a leader in our awesome country.



Outdoor Adventurer Pin



In this arrow of light required adventure scouts will learn and practice what to do when camping. This includes setting up a campsite and tent, what to do in extreme weather, tying a bowline knot, and how to respect the outdoors.



Scouting Adventure Pin



Entering boy scouts is just around the corner and this arrow of light pin will help prepare scouts for this transition. This adventure will revisit the basics of scouting (pocket knives, knots, scout law,) and then focus on the ins and outs of how boy scout troops and patrols work.

AQUATICS



Aquanaut Pin



There's nothing like cooling off with a little bit of swimming! Scouts will learn the safety precautions in and around water and some of the basic swimming strokes. Aquanaut 1 will cover swimming requirements at the Pool. Aquanaut 2 will cover boating requirements at the Lake.



Cub Aquatics



Cubs will learn safety precautions in and around the water and some basic swimming strokes.

ECO-CON



Earth Rocks Pin



There are rocks all around us, but why are they all different from each other? Well, in this adventure, scouts will discover different types of rocks and geological features and realize their importance.



Eco-Cubs



Wolf and Bear specific activities related to Ecology and Conservation.



Into the Wild Pin



There are so many types of birds, animals, insects, fish and reptiles that live all around us. Why do they live where they do? What do they eat? What are their behaviors? In this activity scouts will investigate these questions and many more.



Into the Woods Pin



Trees and plants have a huge impact on our lives. For this pin, scouts will learn and practice identifying different types of trees and plants and how to grow and take care of them.



Webelos Walkabout Pin



Scouts will go on a 3-mile hike. However, before they embark on this amazing hike, they first need to plan it, prepare a nutritious snack, assemble a first aid kit, and recite the outdoor code.

HANDICRAFT



Art Explosion Pin



There is no better way for one to express their creativity than through art. In this adventure, scouts will learn different art techniques and then use them to create beautiful works of art!



Build It Pin



There's nothing like building something with your own hands. Scouts will learn about the different carpentry tools and the safety precautions needed to use them. They will then use some of these tools to build something really cool!



Craft (Cub, Webelos)



Hands-on building project using basic hand tools. Learn how to use tools safely, and choosing the right tool for the task. Craft will vary depending on availability.



Fix It Pin



Everyone enjoys having a handyman around, especially when a toilet is overflowing or the kitchen sink is clogged! In this activity, scouts will learn and practice how to fix basic problems that will inevitably occur around a home.



Game Design (Webelos) Pin



We all enjoy playing games, but who makes them? Well, in this activity the boys will! Scouts will create their own game and teach an adult how to play it.

SCOUTCRAFT



**Cast Iron Chef
Pin**



Who doesn't like to eat? In this simmering activity, scouts will plan and prepare a well-balanced meal and learn how to cook it in the outdoors!



**First Responder
Pin**



Accidents unfortunately happen, and immediate action needs to be taken! What to do you do when your friend breaks a bone, gets a bad cut, bitten by a snake, ... Scouts well learn what to do in these types of emergency situations.



**Looking Back, Look-
ing Forward
Pin**



In this adventure, scouts will create a record of the history of Scouting along with their place in that history. They will also make their very own time capsule.



Outdoor Cubs



Basic outdoor skills instruction.



**Stronger, Faster,
Higher
Pin**



For this pin, scouts will explore why exercising and being active is so important; and why you should always warm-up and cool-down before exercising. They will create an exercise plan and then practice various exercises.

ADMIN



Aware and Care Pin



There are many of us with disabilities. In this adventure, scouts will learn, through activities, what it's like to have impairments, and what they can do to help those with disabilities.



Build My Own Hero Pin



Superman and Batman are not the only heroes. There are heroes all around us! In this adventure scouts will learn about all of the different types of heroes in our community and what it takes for us to become one!



Moviemaking (Webelos) Pin



Who doesn't like a good movie; especially when it is about themselves. Scouts will come up with their own story, then create a storyboard, and then finally make a movie about themselves in a scouting adventure.

SHOOTING SPORTS



Air Rifles



It takes a good aim, and a steady hand to hit the bullseye with an Air Rifle.



Archery (Cub, Webelos)



Become the next Robin Hood, and hit the bulls-eye at the Archery Range.



BB Gun Shooting



It takes a good aim, and a steady hand to hit the bullseye with a BB Gun.
